EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

IF THIS HAPPENS	DO THIS
Tanker/Vehicle Accident	Switch off engine and electrical equipment. Keep people away, warn other traffic. Check for spills, leaks. Call the emergency services: Dial 111
Spill or leak	Keep bystanders away. Wear overalls, waterproof gloves, boots and safety glasses/ goggles. Prevent further spillage. Absorb spilled product and place in a sealable container. Wash down affected area with water plus detergent. Absorb and collect washings and place in the same sealable container for disposal. Dispose to a suitable landfill.
Fire	Call the fire service: Dial 111. Wear PVC Protective clothing including self-contained breathing apparatus. Extinguish fires with foam, dry chemical, carbon dioxide or fine water spray. During a fire toxic fumes may be released. Cool other containers with water to prevent rupture from thermal expansion. Contain run-off. Keep non-involved people away

FIRST AID

If Swallowed:	Do not induce vomiting. For advice contact the National Poisons Centre 0800 POISON (0800 764 766) or a doctor immediately.
If in Eyes	Hold eyelids apart and flush the eye continuously with running water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses if easy to do so. Call a Doctor or National Poisons Centre for advice.
If on Skin	If skin or hair contact occurs, remove contaminated clothing and immediately wash the affected area with soap and water. Do not scrub the skin. Call a Doctor or National Poisons Centre for advice.
If Inhaled	Remove patient to fresh air and rest. If not breathing, give artificial respiration, preferably mouth to nose. For advice contact the National Poisons Centre 0800 POISON (0800 764 766) or a doctor immediately.
